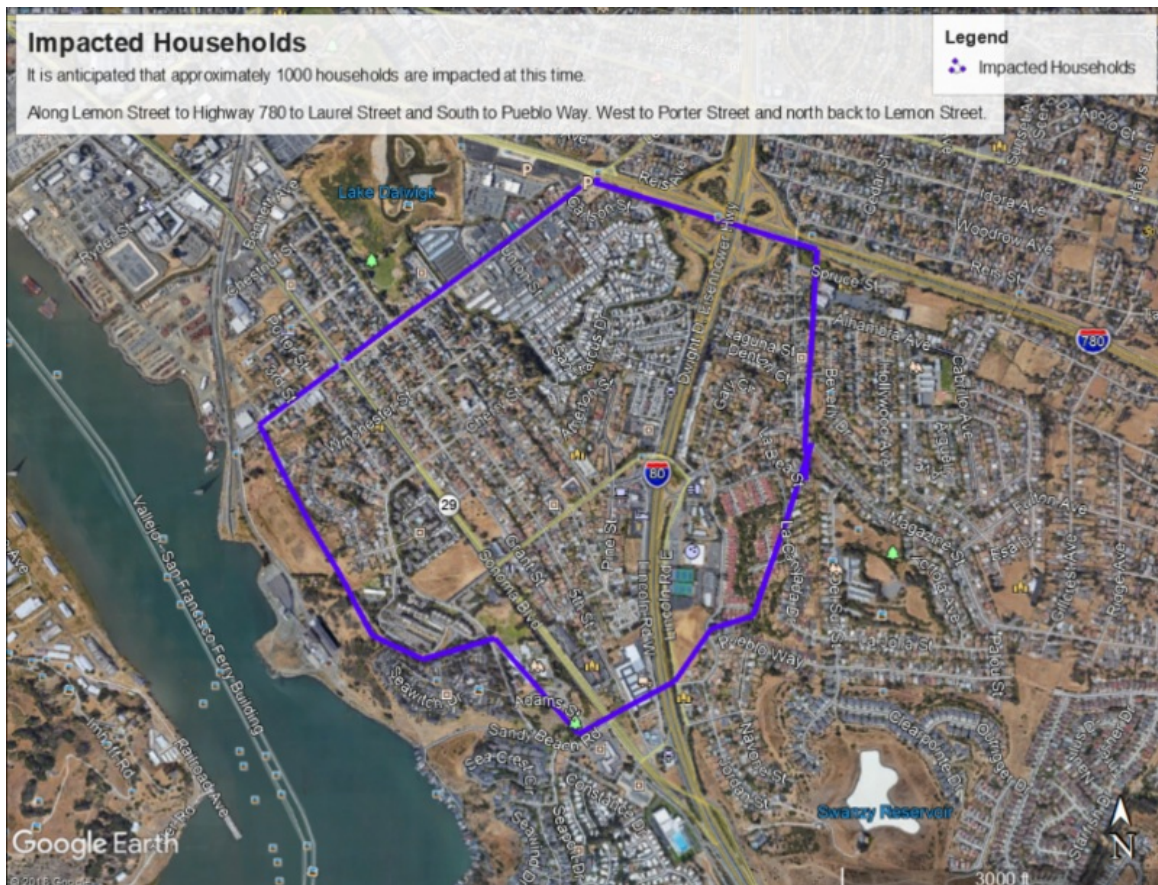


–Vallejo, CA– February 11, 2018

The City of Vallejo is experiencing an issue with the Swanzy Reservoir, that has resulted in sediment being carried into the water lines and pushed out into part of the system. **The water is safe to drink, despite debris and discoloration, though residents are advised to limit usage and only use if absolutely necessary.** Residents may experience no or low water pressure, and may see discoloration and sediment coming from their faucets. Approximately 1000 households are impacted along Lemon Street to Highway 780 to Laurel Street and South to Pueblo Way, west to Porter Street and north back to Lemon Street.



The sensor in the closed system reservoir gave a false read, sucking sediment from the bottom into the system. The problem was discovered early this morning and City crews were dispatched immediately. While not a health issue, it may alarm residents, and the dirt must be removed from the lines. City distribution teams are onsite.

Swanzy is located in south Vallejo, in the hills of the popular neighborhood Glen Cove near the I-80 "Al Zampa Bridge" Bridge. It is one of the oldest reservoirs in the City dating back to the early 1900s.
