EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 20-008

AN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR THE CITY OF VALLEJO IMPOSING AN 8 P.M. CURFEW IN THE CITY OF VALLEJO UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

WHEREAS, the death of George Floyd at the hands of a police officer in Minneapolis, Minnesota has triggered a series of protests throughout the United States many of which have turned violent and resulted in property damage to business, arson, and injuries to police officers and protestors; and

WHEREAS, cities within the State of California have also experienced protests including violence, damage to business, arson, vandalism, and injuries to police officers and protestors; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of California has activated the California National Guard to assist local authorities to mitigate said crimes; and

WHEREAS, the Vallejo Police Department has received credible information that criminal elements intend to engage in widespread violence, acts vandalism, looting and other crimes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Vallejo has declared a City-wide emergency as of June 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.50.070(D)(1) of the City of Vallejo Municipal Code empowers the Director of Emergency Services to make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by any emergency proclaimed by the Director of Emergency Services or by the City Council.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED as follows:

- 1. City of Vallejo Order No. 20-007 is hereby rescinded and replaced in its entirety with this order.
- 2. A temporary curfew is hereby imposed on all residents of the City of Vallejo.
- 3. No persons shall be upon any public street, sidewalk, park, or in any other outdoor public place in the City of Vallejo between the hours of 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. The following are exempt from this order: law enforcement personnel, firefighting personnel, emergency healthcare providers, individuals travelling to and from their workplace, unsheltered persons and representatives of the news media.
- 4. Any person found outside between the hours of 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. are subject to arrest and may be charged with a misdemeanor.

5. This order shall take effect immediately.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERD that this order shall remain in full force and effect until further notice.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERD that this order shall be presented to the City Council for ratification at the earliest possible time.
