#### **Open Businesses:**

- Grocery stores of all kinds
- Liquor stores/gas stations that serve food
- Restaurants, cafeterias, and all food related industries can provide pick-up or delivery
- Cannabis can provide curbside pick-up or delivery
- Laundry mats, drycleaners
- Pharmacies
- Health care providers
- Home improvement stores and stores that sell home appliances, hardware stores
- Pet stores that provide pet food
- Construction workers (plumbers, electricians, inspectors, etc) that helps provide housing and support other essential functions.
- Government functions (fire, police, water services, public work services and housing services that determine eligibility for food, shelter, in-home supportive services, child welfare, adult protective services and social services, and other necessities of life for economically disadvantaged or otherwise needy individuals)
- Businesses that help support government functions and the housing industry
- Maritime businesses
- Most transportation related businesses and/or businesses supporting transportation
- Real property management services and the businesses needed for support (i.e. electrical, plumbing, landscape contractors etc.)
- Wineries and breweries can continue to produce and ship products
- Rental Car businesses and industries that maintain continuity of these services (car-wash and sanitization of these cars).
- Animal shelters and employees
- Residential and commercial real estate services, including settlement services.
- Workers providing disinfection services, for all essential facilities and modes of transportation, and supporting the sanitation of all food manufacturing processes and operations from wholesale to retail.

**Closed Businesses:**

- Salon services (hair, massage, nail, waxing, facials)
- Pet groomers
- Tattoo parlors
- Wine, brewery, distillery tasting rooms
- Bars
- Dine-in restaurants
- Jewelry Stores
- Retail (clothes, shoes, toys, games, candles, and anything not serving food)
- Arcades, bowling alleys, fun centers, movies, art galleries, museums
- Thrift shops
- Sports stadiums
