COVID-19 and the Marina

All,

Thank you for being patient and flexible while the Marina office was closed during the Shelter in Place Order. Here is what you need to know moving forward:

- Marina Staff will continue to be available by phone and email during regular office hours with limited in-person office hours:
 - Updated Office Hours: Monday-Thursday 10 am to 2 pm. CLOSED WEEKENDS.
- Fuel Dock Hours: Remain the same but CLOSED WEEKENDS.
- If you make a visit to the Marina office, <u>FACE MASK/COVERING IS REQUIRED</u>.
 We will only allow one person in the office at a time. Others must wait outside the building.
- Every day, two times a day, Marina Maintenance staff sanitizes frequently touched surfaces including: All restrooms (faucets, flush handles, door handles), walk way railings, dock gate entrances, Office Building surfaces (door handles, railings at stairway, etc.), Laundry Room (table, chairs, face of machines, door handle) plus more!
 - If you have noticed that any of these surfaces are sticky or has a residue, this is the reason, as the sanitizer does not call for being wiped down to ensure it has the time to kill germs by not being quickly wiped away before it can do its job!
 - If you see one of the guys, show some appreciation for keeping the Marina clean and safe!

What if I Abandon My Boat?

Under California law any owner found guilty of abandoning a vessel shall be fined \$1,000 to \$3000, and may be ordered to pay any additional costs for the removal and disposal of the vessel to the removing agency. Abandoning a boat is one of the worst things a boat owner can do to get rid of an unwanted boat. When a boat is abandoned the detrimental effects can be immediate, and may have serious consequences to:

Public safety • Water quality • Environment and sensitive habitats • Navigation • Local businesses • Marinas and waterway residences • Structures and other features • Resources of state and local governments

Proper vessel disposal is a vital part of clean and responsible boating, and if it's your boat it's your responsibility. <u>LET US HELP YOU!</u>

Thinking About Selling your Boat?

A few important reminders regarding boat sales and Slip Rental Agreements:

- Slip Rental Agreements are non-transferable. When selling your boat, make sure the new owner has made arrangements for the boat to be removed from the marina or has completed the application process and executed a Slip Rental Agreement prior to the sale being final.
- Upon termination of a Slip Rental Agreement, unless a new agreement with the new owner has been executed, the original agreement will remain in effect with the previous berther/owner.
- We ask and encourage berthers to write a courtesy letter or email to the marina office notifying us of the intent to sell their hoat. At this time, we will provide a Contract End Form to formally submit notice of departure.

Exploring Northern California's Inland Delta Cruising Grounds, By Don Durant | July 24, 2020 | California Delta

What are you doing with your 'pod' this summer? The Bay is often visited by pods of whales, and now, due to health concerns, it's suggested we all travel with just our family pod. We're hearing from more sailors who are expanding their local sailing explorations of the Bay Area, which includes our warm, sunny, close-to-home Delta cruising grounds.

With this in mind, we invited Don Durant of <u>Club Nautique</u> to share his insights on cruising the Delta in our current July issue: "Let's begin by eliminating the misconception that the Delta is too shallow for sailboats. We've been cruising in the Delta for decades, and *Eureka!*, our Jeanneau 49DS, draws more than 7 feet. So, with that myth set aside, let's plan a cruise! I had fond but fuzzy memories of Delta cruises when I was a kid in the '50s aboard my parents' Stephens cabin cruiser, so when I had a family of my own and our own sailboat, my wife Judy and I planned our first Delta cruise. My childhood experience was distant and I didn't know whom to ask for advice, but I was an experienced sailor and former submarine navigator so I figured, "How hard can it be?" It turned out not to be hard at all, but, as with any cruise, planning improves performance. What follows is a guide for an introductory cruise based on my experience and mistakes (yes, I've made plenty) ..." It's not far away and there's plenty for your pod to explore. You can do it on your own, with friends, and as part of the 12th annual <u>Delta Doo Dah</u>. Read the full story in the July <u>World of Chartering</u>.
