THE COMMUNITY

The City of Vallejo is located in Solano County and has a population of approximately 122,105 residents. Vallejo is a rapidly changing, highly diverse community located midway between the cities of Sacramento and San Francisco. It is a friendly, active waterfront community that attracts innovative, hardworking people and takes great pride in its 151-year history and maritime heritage. With a mild year-round climate and easy access to varied recreational opportunities, residents of Vallejo are situated to take advantage of the best of what the area has to offer. Golf, museums, performing arts, boutique shopping, brewpubs and a wide selection of restaurants are all available in Vallejo. Residents and visitors alike enjoy Vallejo's delightful historical downtown area, weekly downtown farmer's market, and beautifully restored Victorian homes and business facades. Vallejo is also home to Six Flags Discovery Kingdom, one of America's only combination wildlife, oceanarium and theme parks. Vallejo's Main Street Designation in 2000 and two historic districts reflect the City's pride in and emphasis on maintaining the character and heritage of Vallejo. Vallejo is near the major employment and tourist areas in the region, approximately nine miles from Napa, 32 miles from San Francisco, 22 miles from Oakland and 47 miles from Sacramento. It is well connected to these areas via 1-80 and 1-780, as well as Highways 37 and 29. In addition to being close to four major highways, Vallejo is also serviced directly by Union Pacific Railroad and is convenient to the regional ports of Oakland, San Francisco and Richmond. Ferry service is available to San Francisco and air travel is available through San Francisco, Oakland and Sacramento International Airports. The Vallejo City Hall is set in a beautiful Bayfront park with the ferry terminal located nearby. The City has a formal downtown waterfront development plan, which will ultimately transform Vallejo's waterfront area into a transportation oriented mixed-use area of shops, restaurants, office, residential and open space. CITY GOVERNMENT

Vallejo is a full service, charter city with a fiscal year 2018-19 total budget of over \$226.8 million, with a General Fund of approximately \$107.million. The City has an authorized staff of 570 FTEs employed in the following departments: Finance, Human Resources, Information Technology, Police, Fire, Public Works, Water, Community Development, City Manager's Office and City Attorney's Office. Vallejo has a Council-Manager form of government with the Mayor and six-Council Members elected at-large, on a nonpartisan basis, for four-year overlapping terms. The City has prepared a General Fund Five-Year Business Plan and has adopted the following concepts to assure sustainability:

- Live within our means (five-year projection)
- Look to the future (prioritize)
- Do not defer expenses (maintenance, capital)
- Establish emergency reserve (disasters or emergencies)





THE POSITION

The Transportation Superintendent position in the Public Works Department will manage, supervise, plan and coordinate the City's transportation infrastructure plans and projects; coordinate assigned activities with other Public Works divisions, City departments, outside agencies, and the general public; and provide highly responsible and complex staff assistance to the Public Works Director.

This position will lead the City's transportation initiatives by:

- Serving as a liaison between the City of Vallejo and various transportation authorities; representing the City on a variety of transit and transportation boards and commissions.
- Developing and implementing transportation initiatives in order to meet City Council goals.
- Overseeing all transportation matters, including infrastructure improvement projects, transit planning coordination, and active transportation planning.
- Managing transportation related operating and capital budget;
- Providing staff assistance to the Public Works Director, City Council, and related committees and boards.

THE IDEAL CANDIDATE

The Transportation Superintendent will be an energetic, self-motivated, results-oriented leader. An innovative manager who embraces the existing culture and can seamlessly plan and coordinate the City's transportation infrastructure plans and projects. A committed team player who values their role as part of City management.

The ideal candidate will possess five years of responsible supervisory or administrative experience in transportation and public works activities including transportation planning, project management, and budget analysis for operational and capital budgets. Candidate should have excellent oral and written communication skills and have the ability to seem confident and articulate when presenting to boards, commissions, and/or councils. Ability to coordinate planning activities for the City's transportation related infrastructure and systems, including traffic management and project delivery strategies; oversee all aspects of transportation matters; develop and implement the City's transportation initiatives, as defined by City Council, including the Active Transportation, Complete Streets, and other adopted plans that promote increased pedestrian and bicycling activities; participate in the development and implementation of goals, objectives, policies, & priorities for the City's transportation priorities; identify resource needs; and recommend & implement policies and procedures.

A Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with major coursework in public administration, transportation planning or a related field is required.
