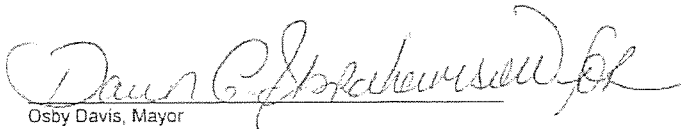

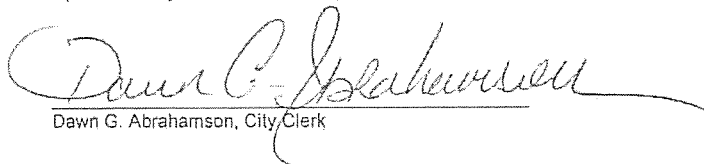

SUBJECT: ADOPT A RESOLUTION APPROVING REALLOCATION OF MEASURE B FUNDS AVAILABLE DUE TO UNFILLED POSITIONS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200,000 TO THE POLICE CADET PROGRAM, \$110,000 TO THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR IN-CAR COMPUTERS AND A PATIENT-CARE RECORDS SYSTEM, \$150,000 TO THE MARE ISLAND FUND FOR SECURITY, AND \$2,040,000 TO PUBLIC WORKS FOR STREET MAINTENANCE, AND EXPRESSING INTENT TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 BUDGET,

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the City Council 1) approve the reallocation of Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions as listed in the Table 2 below; and 2) adopt a resolution of intention to amend the Fiscal Year 2013-14 budget to reflect the reallocation of Measure B funds.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Staff has reviewed the FY 2013-14 Adopted Budget for Measure B and identified potential funds available for reallocation due to budgeted positions which are expected to remain unfilled in Fiscal Year 2013-14. A balanced approach is recommended to the reallocation of these funds to various Measure B Goals and priorities based on Projected FY 2013-14 costs.

Approval of the resolution of intention is the first of a two-step process to amend the Fiscal Year 2013-14 Adopted Budget. If the City Council approves the budget actions at tonight's meeting, it is expected that on October 22, 2013, the City Council will consider a resolution approving this proposed budget amendment.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On June 25, 2013, the City Council discussed and approved a Resolution adopting the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-14 budget, including a Measure B appropriation of \$12,204,256. During these budget discussions, the City Council requested staff to report back at the Council's first meeting in October, with an estimate of Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions. At that time, the Council expressed a desire to consider reallocation of these unspent funds for street maintenance purposes.

Measure B Funds available due to unfilled positions

The first quarter of the Fiscal Year 2013-14 is now complete and staff has had an opportunity to review personnel staffing levels for Measure B funded projects and projected salary savings for the balance of the fiscal year. As instructed by City Council, staff has prepared the following table (Table 1) summarizing the

Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions, compared to the FY 2013-14 Adopted Budget by goal and project:

Field Police Officers: The City has adopted an approach of filling vacant sworn Police Officer positions in the department, by first filling vacancies in General Fund positions and thereafter filling vacancies in Measure B funded positions. These positions are being filled first since they are permanent positions based upon revenue from permanent revenue sources (Measure B is a ten year tax). As the Police Department does not expect to hire all of the Measure B funded positions this year, there will be significant salary savings.

General Plan Update: The Director of Community and Economic Development position has just recently been filled, and it is not anticipated that the Economic Development Manager and Administrative Clerk II positions will be filled prior to January 1, 2014, resulting in six months of Measure B salary savings.

Implement Economic Development Strategy: The Community and Economic Development Department does not anticipate the filling of two (2) vacant positions until January 1, 2014, resulting in 6 months of salary savings on this project.

All other Measure B funded positions have been filled, and no additional salary savings are projected.

Recommended reallocation of available funds

Staff has reviewed the recent budget discussions of the City Council to recommend a plan for the reallocation of Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions for City Council consideration. During the FY 2013-14 budget discussions, the Street Maintenance project was identified as a priority for any available unspent funds;

support was also expressed for the concept of a Police Cadet Program; and the importance and need for Economic Development activities was articulated.

Overall, the City Council took a balanced approach to the allocation of Measure B funds and staff has applied this approach in developing recommendations for City Council consideration. The following table (Table 2) contains a listing of staff's recommendations for the reallocation of Measure B funds, available due to unfilled positions, compared to the FY 2013-14 Adopted Budget by goal and project:

In Car Computers: The Fire Department is recommending the purchase of 15 in car computers, including hardware and software, in conjunction with purchases already authorized in the Police Department. This new equipment would restore the ability of Fire Department personnel to access dispatch data in vehicles, access patient care records, and reduce duplicate data entry by dispatchers.

Police Cadet Program: The Police Department is recommending the funding of a new Police Cadet Program with anticipated savings from unspent Measure B Field Police Officer funds. This item was previously discussed with City Council by the Police Chief and this quantifies and seeks formal approval of that request.

Street Maintenance: The Public Works Department is recommending additional funding for the Street Maintenance project to enhance maintenance of local residential City streets which are not eligible for federal or state funding (e.g., overlay, slurry seal and crack sealing). Funding would augment spending from the General Fund for street maintenance and move forward the timeline for improving City streets.

North Mare Island Safety and Security: The Economic Development Department is recommending Measure B funding for security patrols on North Mare Island, to discourage vandalism any illegal occupancy of vacant structures.

General Plan Update: The Economic Development Department is recommending that the Measure B salary cost savings associated with unfilled positions in this department remain within the "General Plan Update" project. This would allow the new Director of the department an opportunity to assess how best to utilize these funds in achieving the City's goals for this project.

Implement Economic Development Strategy: The Community and Economic Development department is recommending that the Measure B salary cost savings associated with unfilled positions in this department remain within the "Implement Economic Development Strategy" project. This would allow the new Director of the department an opportunity, to assess how best to utilize these funds in achieving the City's goals for this project.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact on the non-Measure B General Fund resulting from the approval of this recommendation, as this is merely a reallocation by City Council, of previously approved Measure B appropriations.

The recommended Fiscal Year 2013-14 budget adjustment will reallocate \$2,500,000 in Measure B funds available due to unfilled Police Department positions by transferring \$200,000 to the Police Cadet Program; transferring \$110,000 to a Fire Department project to install in-car computers and a patient care records system; transferring \$150,000 as City contribution to the Mare Island Fund for North Mare Island security; and transferring the remaining \$2,040,000 to a Public Works street maintenance project.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it is not a project which has a potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, pursuant to CEQA Guideline section 15378.

RESOLUTION APPROVING REALLOCATION OF MEASURE B FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$200,000 TO THE POLICE CADET PROGRAM, \$110,000 TO THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR IN-CAR COMPUTERS AND A PATIENT-CARE RECORDS SYSTEM, \$150,000 TO THE MARE ISLAND FUND FOR SECURITY, AND \$2,040,000 TO PUBLIC WORKS FOR STREET MAINTENANCE, AND EXPRESSING INTENT TO AMEND THE FISCAL YEAR 2013-2014 BUDGET

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Vallejo as follows:

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2013, the City Council discussed and approved a Resolution adopting the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-14 budget, including a Measure B appropriation of \$12,204,256 in total; and

WHEREAS, during budget discussions, City Council requested Staff to report back in October, with an estimate of Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions and allocating funds to street maintenance; and

WHEREAS, staff reviewed existing Measure B projects to identify and recommend a plan for the reallocation of Measure B funds available due to unfilled positions for City Council consideration; and

WHEREAS, during the FY 2013-14 budget discussions, street maintenance was identified as a priority for available funds; support was expressed for the Police Cadet Program; and the importance and need for Economic Development activities was articulated; and

WHEREAS, City Charter Section 703 requires that available funds not included in the budget may be appropriated by the City Council after giving at least one week's notice of intention to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Vallejo does hereby declare its intention to amend the Fiscal Year 2013-14 Budget to reallocate \$2,500,00 in Measure B funds available due to unfilled Police Department positions by transferring \$200,000 to the Police Cadet Program; transferring \$110,000 to a Fire Department project to install in-car computers and a patient care records system; transferring \$150,000 as City contribution to the Mare Island Fund for North Mare Island security; and transferring the remaining \$2,040,000 to a Public Works street maintenance project as follows:
