Community Partner and Advocate for Vallejo since 2000. Mr. Wilson is known for his excellent fundraising and networking skills. His community involvement includes the Vallejo Naval & Historical Museum, The Vallejo Chamber of Commerce, ARC Solano, Vallejo symphony, Artist Community and the Humane Society of the North Bay, where he served as Director from 2003 to 2014.

2) Overview of Organization/Mission and History

In 1974 the Vallejo Senior Citizens' Council Inc. was established to assume responsibility for operating the Florence Douglas Senior Center. The Vallejo Senior Citizen Council was comprised of one representative from each of the following agencies: Social Security, GVRD, Welfare Dept., Office of Economic Opportunity, Red Cross, Vallejo Adult School and each senior club. The FDSC founded in 1977, is a 14,000 sq. ft. city owned facility located in the central core area of Vallejo. The FDSC provides social, educational, recreational, health, nutritional and consumer advice, counseling, and activities. The FDSC is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit, multi-purpose, all-inclusive, service center that directly provides over 50 regular programs to seniors. It operates with minimal professional staff, and the assistance of a large pool of volunteers. An initial request for funding was met by grants awarded by HUD \$40K, State of CA \$9K and the City of Vallejo \$25 K. The Florence Douglas Senior Center was named for the incumbent mayor who was instrumental in soliciting funds and services for construction.

In 1992, a Community Development Block Grant of \$500,000 created a 2,500 Sq. Ft. expansion of the original building to house a thrift/gift shop, a library/recreational room and new restrooms. To meet the growing needs of seniors in Vallejo and Solano County, the Executive Board of the Vallejo Senior Citizens' Council hired a paid professional director to manage and expand programs and services.

A subsequent grant in 2002 increased parking and made the building handicapped compliant. A CDBG grant in 2006 funded much needed repairs, waterproofing, painting, re-roofing and re-paving.

Currently the center has a paid staff of one full time Executive Director, part-time maintenance employee, one part-time Bookkeeper and one part-time Customer Service/Clerical employee and 100 Volunteers.

Mission Statement

- To foster and promote programs and services for the charitable, educational, social, and recreational needs of persons 50 years of age and over.
- To be the community focal point for senior services and programs, as we have been since 1974.
- To provide recreational, educational and social activities, and a nutrition program
- To provide an extensive information and referral service, coordinating services with other agencies serving Solano, Napa, and Contra Costa Counties.

3) Services Proposed and Clients Served

The Board of Directors of the Florence Douglas Senior Center (FDSC) respectfully request a one-year Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) of \$20,000 (2015 – 2016) to support our Diner's Delight program serving over 12,000 nutritious meals every year to the seniors of our community.

The Florence Douglas Senior Center provides Vallejo's largest Meals on Wheels program - the Diner's Delight. We service more clients than the other two Vallejo Meals on Wheels drop-in facilities combined. We are Solano County's largest center for Meals on Wheels Service and the only non-city-funded facility. Currently we have enrolled 120 seniors and serve an average of 45 seniors daily; predominantly female, the majority are age 65 an older and of low to moderate income, living alone in rented or owned accommodations. The minimum age to participate in the program is 60 years.

There is a constant increase in demand for service, and we anticipate as the baby boomer population reaches its senior years that the need for services will escalate considerably.

The Diner's Delight program provides balanced nutritional meals in a warm, welcoming and safe atmosphere. It allows the participants to socialize or avail themselves of the multiple programs and services on offer:

- Information and referral counseling, employment registry, free tax preparations, telephone reassurance
- Health clinics, health insurance counseling, congregate meals
- Spanish classes, basic, advanced, genealogy and computer graphic classes taught by certified instructors and volunteers.

- Exercise classes: line dancing for beginners and advanced, yoga, tai chi, zumba, nonaerobic Jazzercise for seniors
- Transportation discount tickets for Taxi Scrip, Bart, Dial-A-Ride and Vallejo Transit
- A weekly craft day: woodcarving, painting, crocheting, knitting, quilting, stamp art, and fabric painting
- A lending library and puzzle table
- Travel services offering venture and casino trips
- Weekly card games, chess, bingo, scrabble, dominoes, and mahjong
- Bi-monthly and monthly meeting accommodations provided to senior social and fraternal clubs.
- Weekly and monthly special events for fun and fund-raisers
- Annual health fair provides free flu inoculations, medical screenings, and medical information
- Annual Community Christmas Day dinner serving seniors, families and children
- A Gift Shop provides seniors with additional income through the sale of their handcrafted items, and the opportunity to volunteer and socialize.

The centerpiece of our programs is the hosting of the Diner's Delight weekday Meals on Wheels program. The demand for this service is growing mostly due to the increased cost of food and transportation. The costs associated with this program account for the majority of our daily operating expenses.

Every day the FDSC provides:

- Four hours availability of our 100 person dining room, table set-up and break down
- Storage for service items
- Volunteer servers
- A commercial kitchen meeting expensive inspections and codes, grease traps and detergents. A new dishwasher was purchased in 2006 for this program.
- Paper/plastic goods
- Tea/Coffee.
- Utilities
- Cleaning and trash removal
- Site maintenance, handicapped accessible bathrooms

Without the ability to service the Diner's Delight Program the neediest of our senior population will be denied the opportunity to avail themselves of the social, physical, emotional, intellectual, vocational and spiritual dimensions of wellness and active aging that the center offers along with the healthy meals.

The Florence Douglas Senior Center is ready to extend services for this program July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016. The Diner's Delight Meals Program is an ongoing every weekday throughout the year service for seniors.


